- Duluth contains 9,168 acres of city parkland, 162 parks, over 300 miles of recreational trails, and 16 designated trout streams
- Minnesota Point is one of the largest baymouth bars in the world
- Duluth is home to two Important Bird Areas (IBA), recognized as globally important habitats for the conservation of bird populations

Permits/Rentals
Permits are required for all wedding and special events, regardless of size. A permit is required for private events that include 40 or more attendees. Permits are recommended to ensure availability of a space regardless of event size. Park amenities are available to everyone on a first come, first serve basis unless the space has already been permitted. Indoor recreation center buildings are available for rent. Book park and building spaces online at duluthmn.gov/parks.

Watercraft
All watercraft longer than 10' must be licensed (unless registered in another state). Stop aquatic activities and comply with regulations that require boaters to inspect and wash their craft to prevent the spread of invasive species.

Dogs
All dogs must be on leash (except in designated parks and trails). Clean up after your pet to keep trails and dogs clean. Dogs are not allowed on groomed cross-country ski trails. Official dog parks are located at Observation Park, Keene Creek Park, Gary New Duluth Park and Jean Duluth Park.

Cross-Country Skiing
All public cross-country ski areas require a Minnesota Ski Pass, except LMV, Bayview Nature Area, Spirit Mountain Nordic Trails and Boulder Lake Management Area. No walking, biking or dogs allowed on groomed cross-country ski trails. Trail conditions can be found at 218-730-4323 or duluthmn.gov.

Trail Etiquette
Avoid trail use when trails are wet, especially after rainfall events. Trails are closed in early spring and late fall to avoid damage. For current conditions, go to duluthmn.gov/parks.

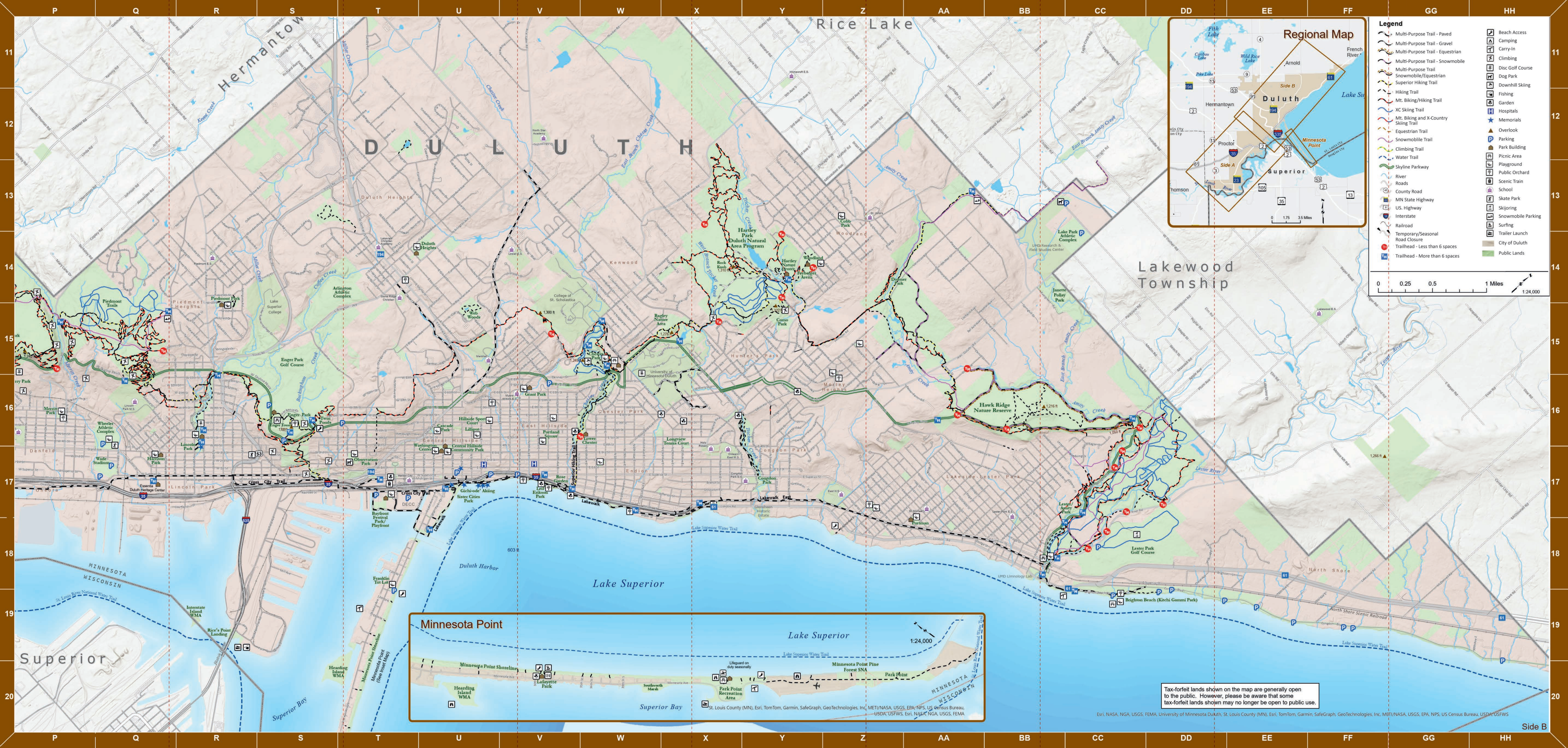
Accessible Trails

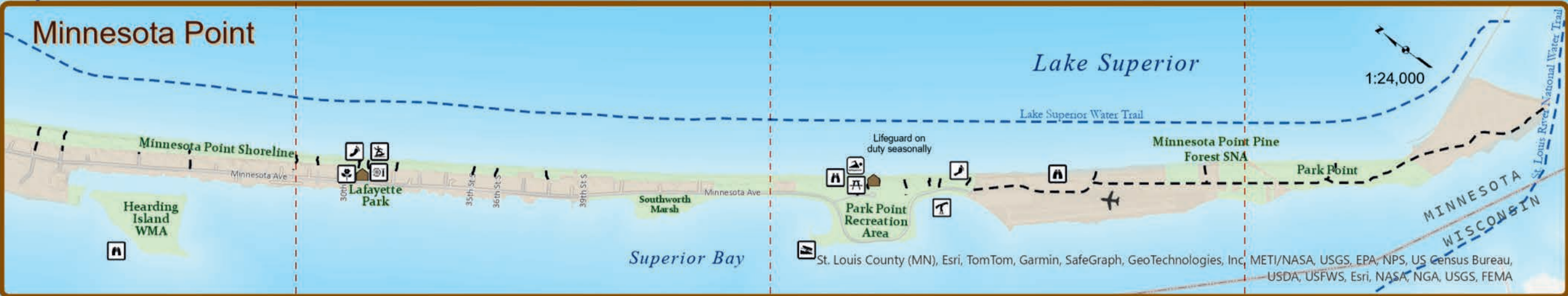
